The Greatest Silence has been heralded as a “poignant and powerful documentary” that exposes the “soul-ripping inhumanity” of the systematic kidnappings, rapes, torture and murders of women in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Through interviews with survivors and community members, it sends a clarion call for collective action to combat rape and other forms of violence against women in times of war and peace in the DRC and around the world.

The Greatest Silence won the Special Jury Prize in Documentary at the 2008 Sundance Film Festival, and has been screened for the British House of Commons, the International Criminal Court, the US Department of State and the Congolese National Assembly in Kinshasa DRC.
